RECOMMENDATION OF THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR TO THE EXECUTIVE BOARD

FOR AN INCREASED ALLOCATION TO GREECE AND YUGOSLAVIA

1. At the last session of the Executive Board, it was stated (E/1737, July 1950)

Greece

80. The Executive Board allocated \$145,000 to Greece for milk, fish liver oil\*\* and sugar to continue supplementary feeding to the end of 1950 for 580,000 children and nursing and pregnant mothers and 40,000 infants.

81. The resettlement of several hundreds of thousands of refugees in Northern Greece entails a further period of rehabilitation during which the needs of supplementary feeding for children will continue to be great. It was the recommendation of the Administration that the Fund envisage providing supplies to Greece to continue supplementary feeding to the summer of 1951.

82. The representative of Greece drew the attention of the Board to the very special conditions existing in his country. With the allocation of \$145,000 recommended by the Programme Committee for food assistance to Greek children it would not be possible to extend the present feeding programme for the full number of children and mothers beyond July 1950, although the serious need for this assistance at the present level would continue undiminished until the summer of next year. The Executive Board recognized that, in view of the particularly great needs of Greek children, it was desirable to continue the present feeding programme until the end of the coming winter. The Board, therefore, authorized the Administration to permit continuance of the feeding programme at the present level, and to circularize the Board as soon as resources permit with regard to an increased allocation."

"83. Yugoslavia, especially in the southern portion is still in need of milk for children. It is hoped that by the spring of 1951 a supply of milk to certain priority groups will be assured with the assistance of the milk plants for the conservation of local milk supplies being established with UNICEF aid. The Executive Board allocated \$185,000 for supplies and fats sufficient to continue feeding of 600,000 children to the end of the year, compared with 1,200,000 at the present time. In view of the needs in Yugoslavia, the Board also authorized the Administration to permit continuance of feeding at the present level, and to circularize the Board as soon as resources permit with regard to an increased allocation."

2. Since the last session of the Executive Board, initial proceeds equivalent to \$150,000 have been reported from the current UNAC campaign in Australia, and more than a further \$75,000 is expected. Owing to the time needed for procurement and shipment, I am proposing that the Board approve now an additional allocation of \$200,000 to Greece and Yugoslavia in accordance with the Executive Board wishes expressed in paragraphs 82 and 83 of E/1737.

3. At the time of recent Executive Board session, the Administration indicated that there might be additional milk requirements for both countries. However, a more recent review of stock positions in Greece indicates that present allocations may provide sufficient milk to carry on present programmes until the end of the year, and hence the Administration is not requesting additional skim milk at this time. In case of Yugoslavia, because of further reduction in the price of milk, due to advantageous purchases by the Fund from the U.S. Department of Agriculture, which are reported to the Board in an accompanying paper, it will now be possible to provide the full requirements of skim milk until the end of 1950 within the existing country allocations for this commodity.

4. In Greece, there has been a very strong preference for meat as a supplementary item in the child feeding programme. This commodity is presently available for purchase in Australia and has previously been provided to the feeding programme

in Greece. It is recommended that \$100,000 be allocated for meat for the Greece feeding programme during the second half of 1950. It would be the intention of the Administration to purchase this meat in Australia.

5. The Yugoslav Government has indicated strong preference for additional quantities of fat in their feeding programme for the second half of 1950. The Administration recommends that \$100,000 be allocated to Yugoslavia for this purpose. It would be the intention of the Administration to purchase this fat in Australia.

6. In the light of the above information, members of the Executive Board are requested to indicate whether they approve the above recommended allocations. In order to permit early procurement in the event of approval, I should appreciate receiving the views of members as early as convenient.
