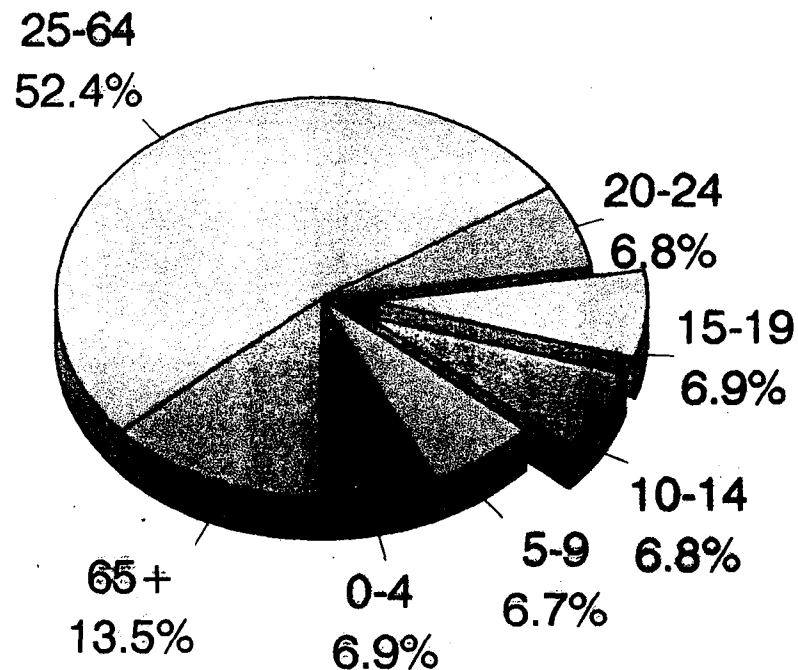

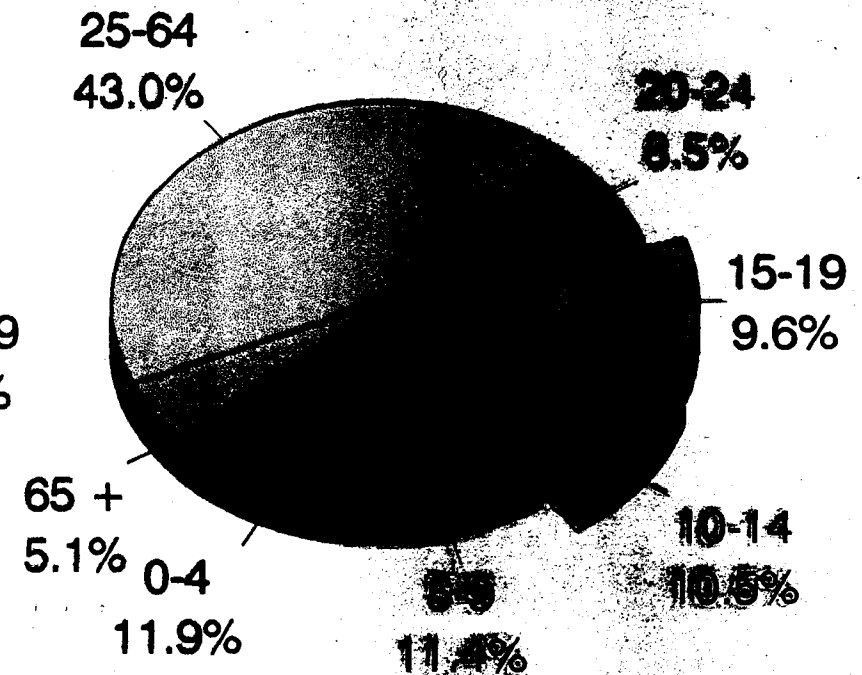
Adolescents as a Proportion of Total Population

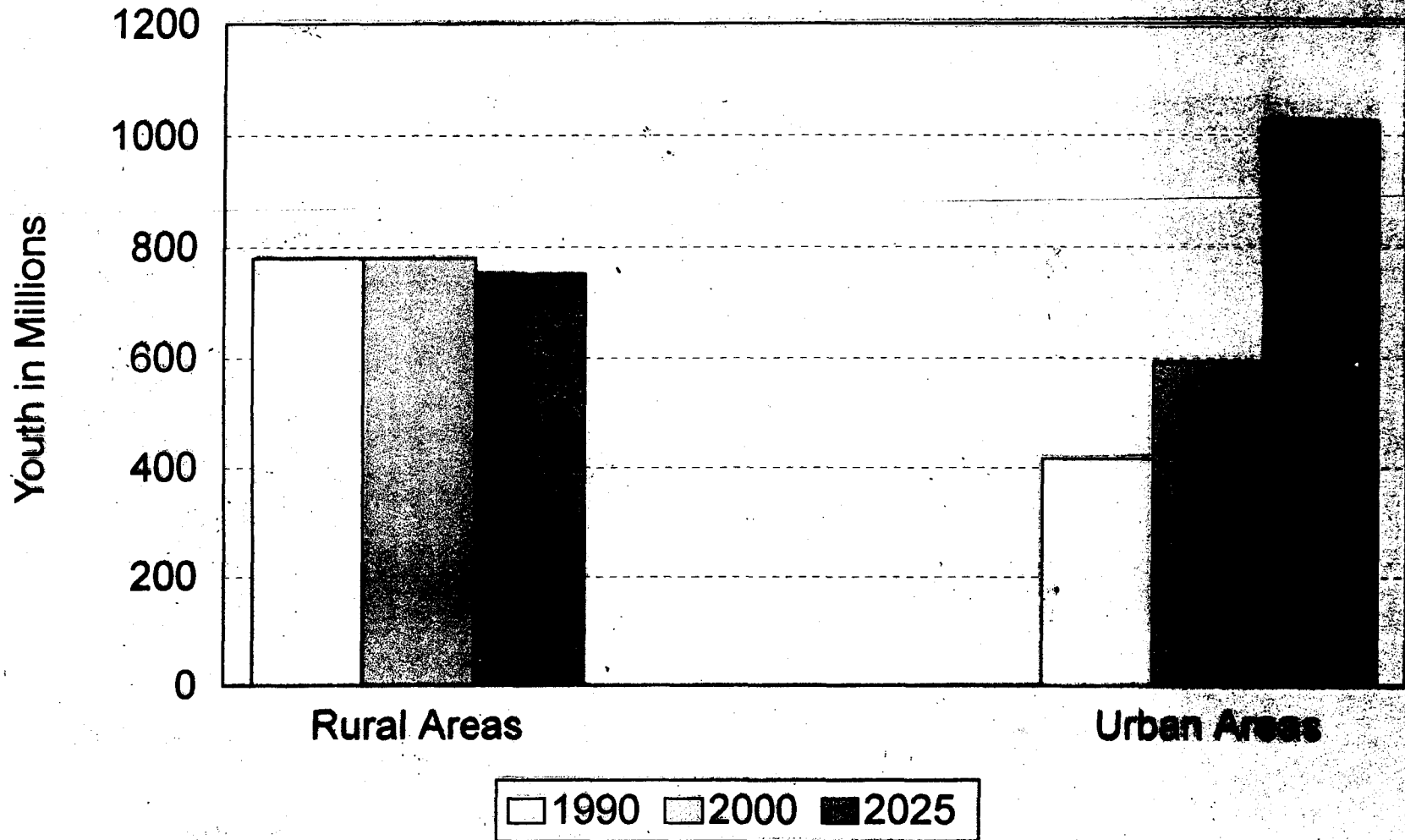

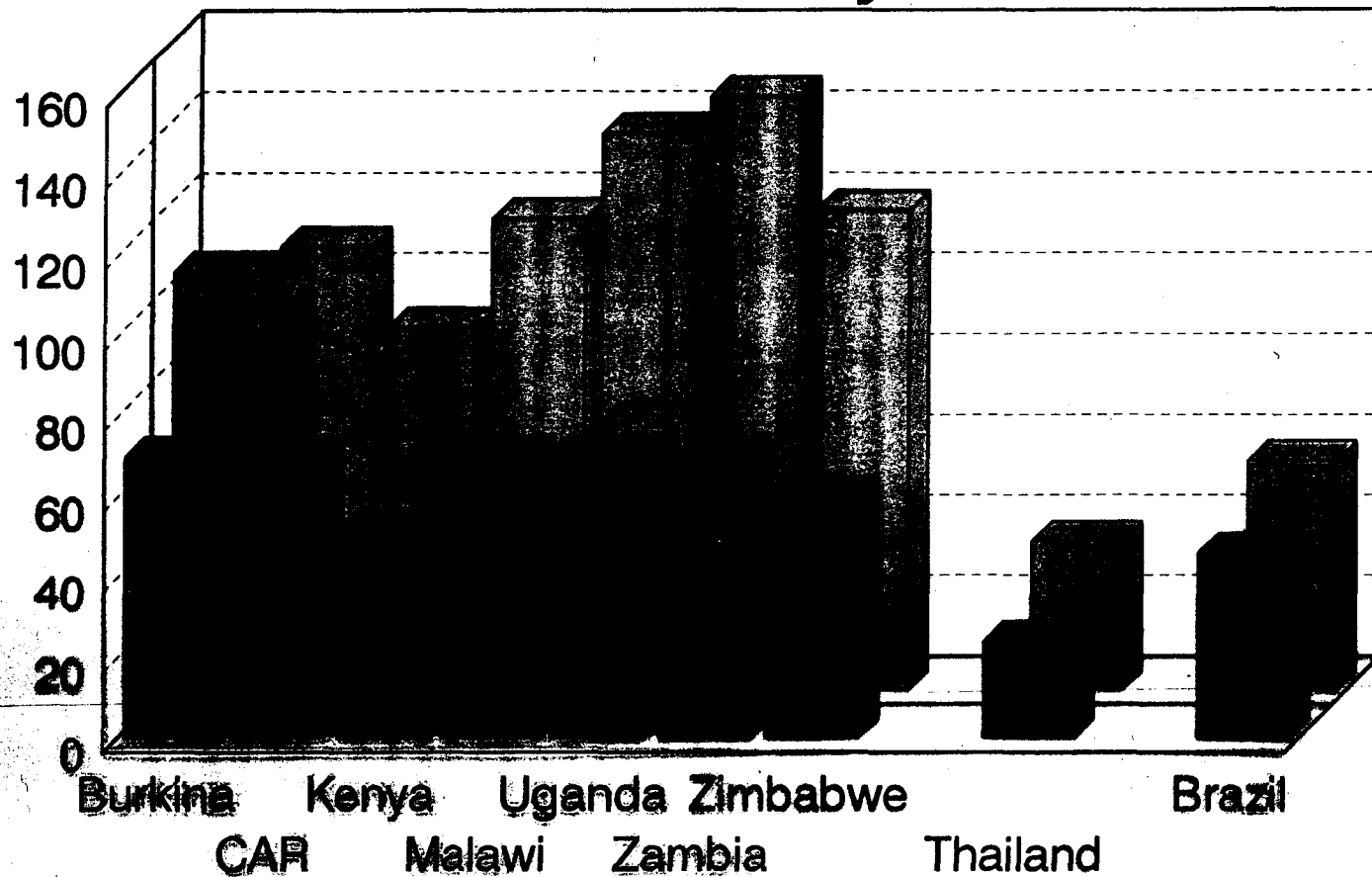
Migration Trends of Young People

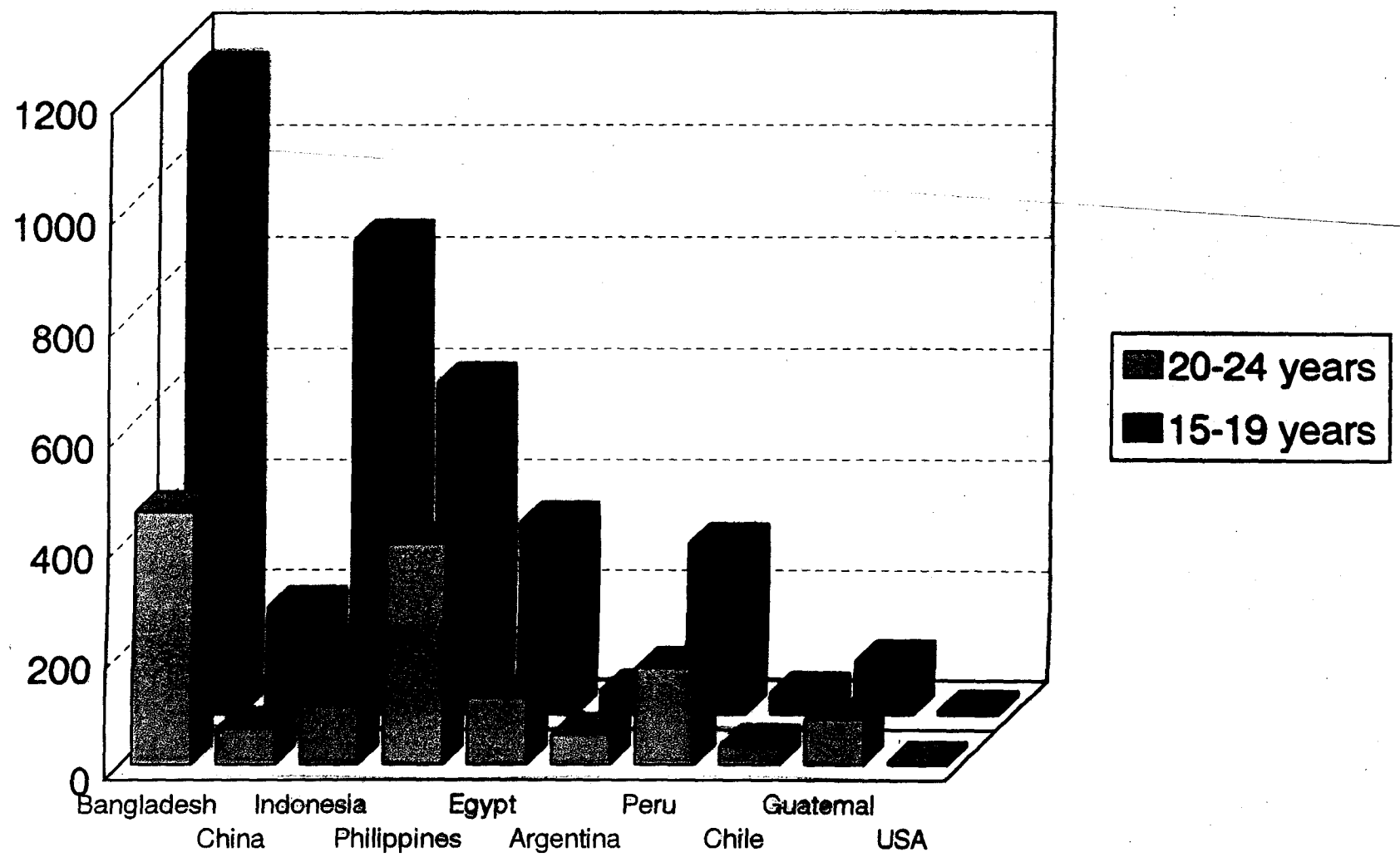
Year 2000 Under-Five Mortality Goals: Excess Mortality from AIDS

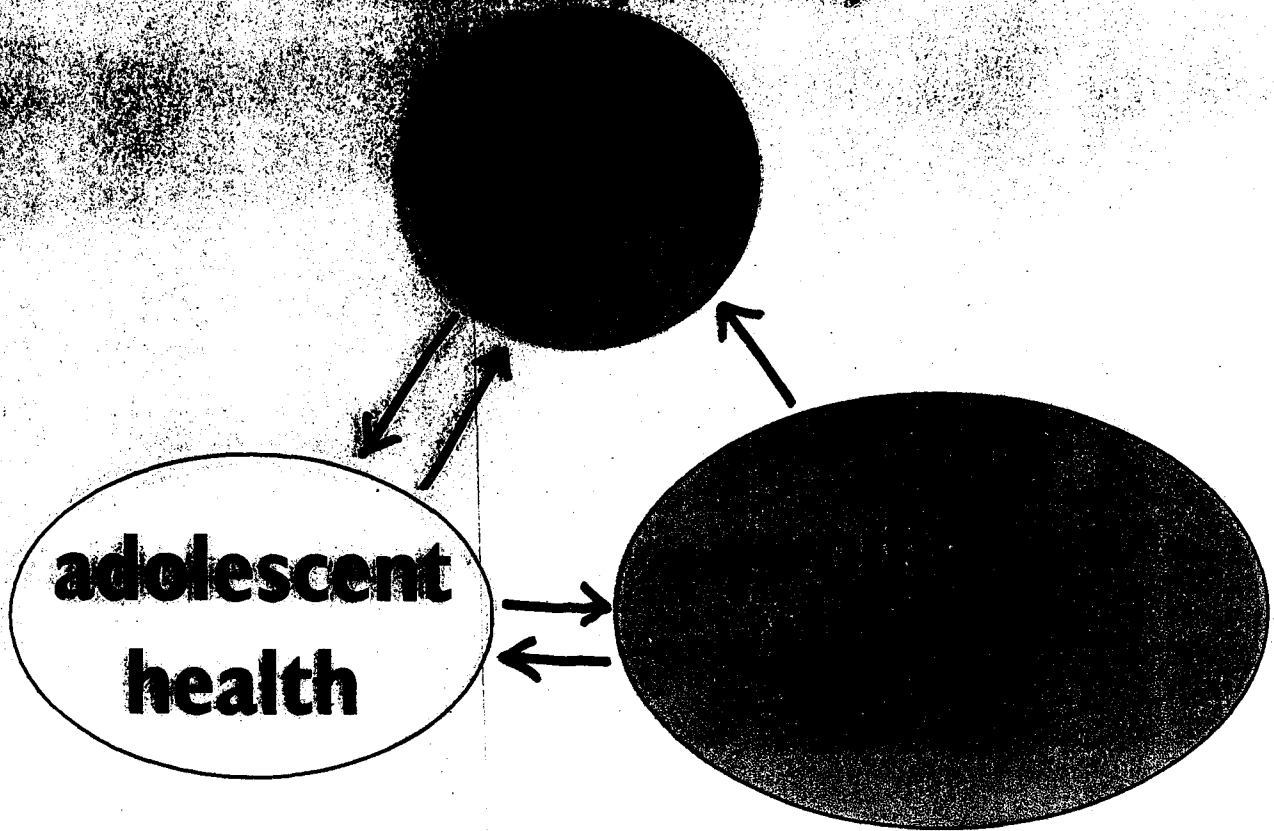
Age-specific Maternal Mortality Ratios Comparison of 15-19 and 20-24 year old women

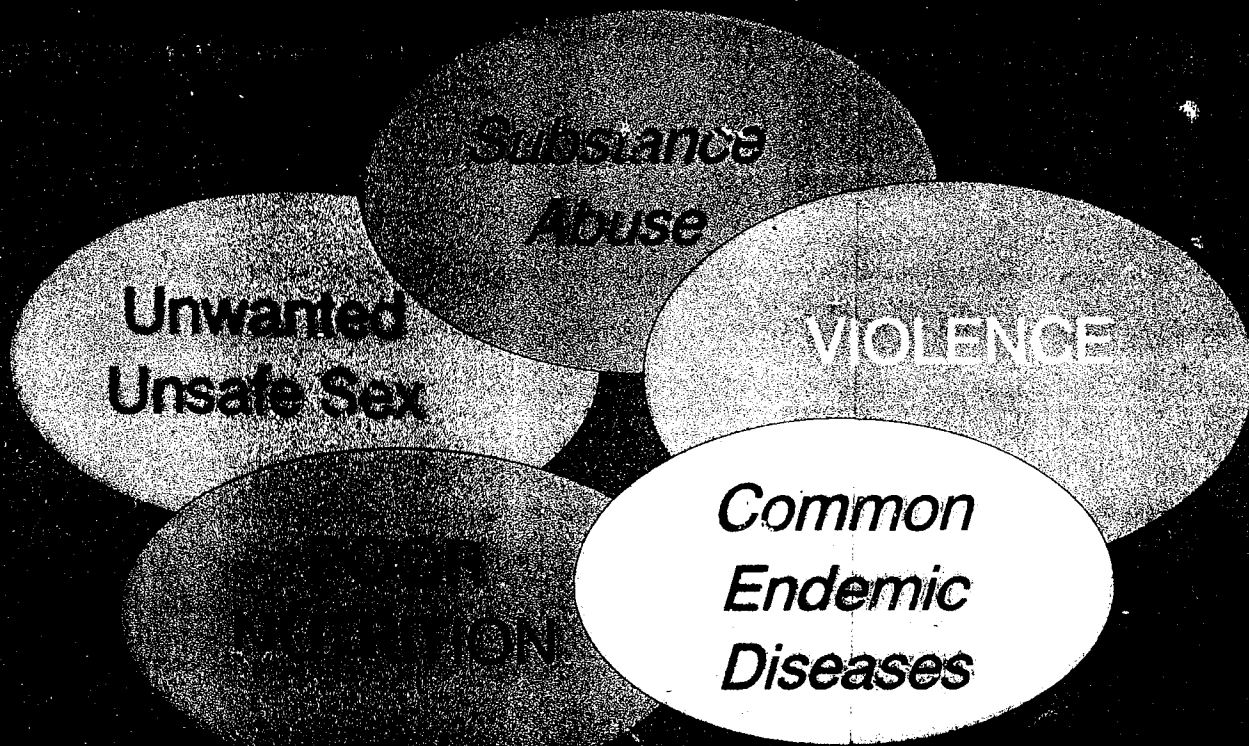

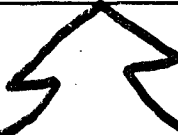

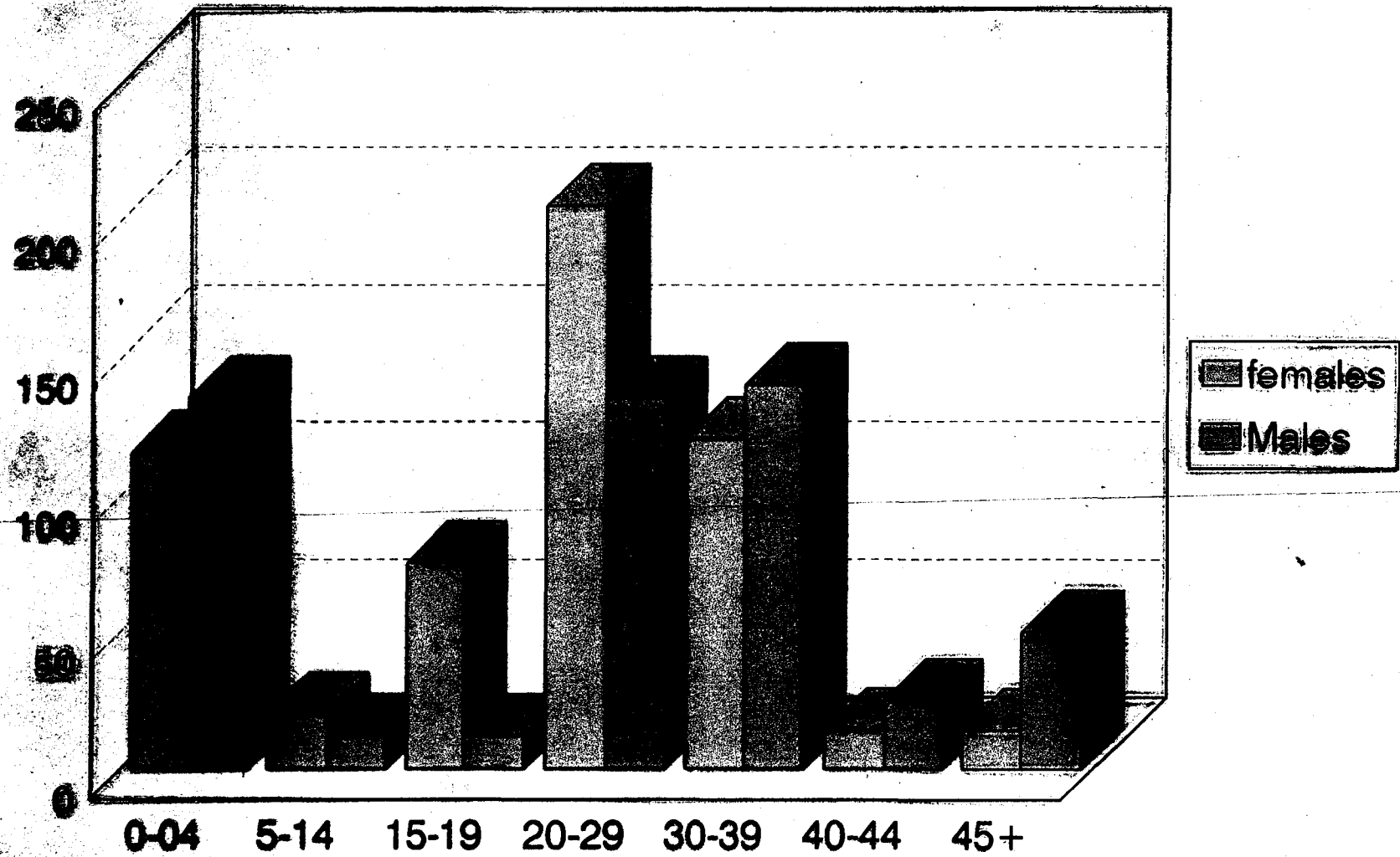
YOUNG PEOPLE'S HEALTH AND DEVELOPMENT

LEVELS OF CAUSATION

Outcomes Health and Development	Low birth weight and child mortality, abortion and maternal mortality, HIV/AIDS, prostitution, disability, school-absenteeism and drop-outs, illiteracy, diabetes, heart disease and cancer, poor productivity, violence and delinquency, etc.
Immediate Causes	High-risk behaviours and settings: unwanted and/or unsafe sex, substance abuse (including alcohol and tobacco), accidents and violence, poor nutrition, living on the streets, harmful work conditions, etc.
	Failure to meet young people's rights to: information and skills; education, health and other services; an unsafe and unsupportive environment; few opportunities to participate
	Poverty, rapid social change and urbanisation, gender, ethnic and other forms of discrimination, unemployment, wars and emergencies
