The world is at a unique crossroads, changing dramatically right before our eyes.

The reduction in global tensions provides the opportunity to turn from confrontation to a major effort to save the lives and improve the living conditions of children everywhere.

A World Summit for Children at United Nations headquarters in New York this September will bring world leaders together to put the needs of children first.

Oral rehydration therapy. Immunization. Breastfeeding. Growth monitoring. Simple, lowcost methods that have already proven their effectiveness saving millions of young lives. What's needed is a strong personal commitment by world leaders to increase funding, mobilize communities, and save an additional 50 million children over the next decade.

Helping children means helping their parents -with community-based programmes that provide clean water, day care, income for women... programmes that monitor nutrition and other basic health care services.

Entertainment and education attracts parents and their children.

A children's circus promotes community pride, and helps forge links between parents, street educators, and information about nutrition and health.

A concert audience is entertained, as it learns the value of immunization.

Role-playing teaches youngsters the dangers of AIDS.

Other activities reach out to street children, and help them re-enter society. The first step: drop-in shelters that offer a hot meal, a shower, a place to play, medical treatment, adult guidance and, most important of all, the affection they so badly need.

A corn mill means less time in the kitchen and more time learning to read. It also frees mothers to acquire the knowledge that can save a child's life.

Personal contact, the mass media -- all forms of communication -- get everyone involved and help assure sustained progress.

A grand alliance can help ease the suffering of children caused by economic problems, and the aftermath of war.

The United Nations' adoption of the Convention on the Rights of the Child is an important first step toward making basic children's rights part of international law.

The next step is for world leaders to become personally involved and forge policies for the survival, protection and development of children.

The goals are simple: provide children with the environment that lets them develop to their fullest.

Protect children from exploitation, war and disease.

These are attainable goals that the people want. Now is the time for leaders to meet at the World Summit for Children and seize this moment to provide national security based on people, not on weapons.

Time is important, because the children cannot wait. They need and deserve first call on every country's resources now.

Because these children are tomorrow's world.
