
***Note:** Dr. Egger resigned officially from the Swiss Federal Department in December 1956, to devote himself entirely to a career within the United Nations Organization.

NEW DEPUTY EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR FOR UNICEF'S PROGRAMMES TAKES OFFICE

Dr. Charles Egger of Switzerland Replaces Mrs. Adelaide Sinclair in Key Post

UNITED NATIONS, N.Y. October 4, 1967— Dr. Charles Egger of Switzerland took office as Deputy Executive Director for Programmes for the United Nations Children's Fund (UNICEF) today, it was announced by Henry R. Labouisse, UNICEF Executive Director.

As Deputy Executive Director, Dr. Egger becomes the highest-ranking Swiss national in United Nations service. His new duties include administering UNICEF aid to projects affecting the health, education and welfare of millions of children in 120 countries around the world. He succeeds Mrs. Adelaide Sinclair, a Canadian, who retired last week after a twenty-year-career with UNICEF.

Dr. Egger's UNICEF career began in 1948 when he was appointed Chief of post-war emergency operations in Bulgaria. From 1951 to 1961, he served as Director of UNICEF's work in Europe, the Middle East and Africa. For the past six years, Dr. Egger has been Director for UNICEF in South-Central Asia, a region covering India, Ceylon, Afghanistan, Mongolia and Nepal.

Born in Basle, Switzerland, Dr. Egger was educated at Basle University, from which he holds a Doctor of Law degree. His work in international aid began in 1943 when he was appointed to the Swiss Federal Political Department working in international relief activities. From 1944 to 1948, he served as Deputy Director of Don Suisse, a Swiss war relief organization. Fifty-one years old, Dr. Egger is married to the former Marie-Elisabeth Rohr. They have four children.

Dr. Egger's UNICEF career began in 1948 when he was appointed Chief of post-war emergency operations in Bulgaria. From 1951 to 1961 he served as Director of UNICEF's work in Europe, the Middle East and Africa. For six years thereafter, from 1961 to 1967, Dr. Egger was Director of UNICEF in South-Central Asia, a region covering India, Afghanistan, Mongolia, Nepal and Sri Lanka (then Ceylon).

In October 1967, Dr. Egger assumed the post of Deputy Executive Director, Programmes, at UNICEF Headquarters. As Deputy Executive Director, Dr. Egger became the highest ranking Swiss in the United Nations service. His duties included the review and administering of UNICEF aid to projects affecting the health, nutrition, education and welfare of millions of children in some 120 countries the world over.

In January 1977, ^{with the ~~help~~ ~~of~~ ~~the~~ ~~Swiss~~ ~~of~~ ~~the~~ ~~U.N.~~} Dr. Egger assumed responsibility for contributing to the formulation of UNICEF's global programme assistance policies, relations with other agencies and governments and consultation with UNICEF Field Representatives through field visits.

Born in Basle, Switzerland, Dr. Egger was educated at Basle University, from which he holds a Doctor of Law degree. His work in international aid began in 1943 when he was appointed to the Swiss Federal Political Department, working in international relief activities. From 1944 to 1948, he served as Deputy Director of Don Suisse, a Swiss war relief organisation. Sixty-one years old, Dr. Egger is married to the former Marie-Elisabeth Rohr. They have four children.

HEREWITH CV DR. EGGER:

A SWISS NATIONAL, WAS BORN IN BASLE, SWITZERLAND, ON 15 APRIL 1916. HE RECEIVED IN 1942 HIS DOCTORATE IN LAW FROM THE UNIVERSITY OF BASLE. PRIOR TO JOINING UNICEF DR. EGGER WAS APPOINTED IN 1943 TO THE FEDERAL POLITICAL DEPARTMENT OF SWITZERLAND IN BERNE AS ASSISTANT TO THE DELEGATE FOR INTERNATIONAL RELIEF ACTIVITIES. IN 1945 HE WAS NOMINATED DEPUTY DIRECTOR OF DON SUISSE, THE SWISS ORGANIZATION FOR RELIEF TO WAR VICTIMS. IN AUGUST 1948 DR. EGGER WAS APPOINTED TO THE UNICEF STAFF AND WAS CHIEF OF THE UNICEF MISSION IN BULGARIA. HE WAS TRANSFERRED IN 1949 TO UNICEF'S EUROPEAN HEADQUARTERS IN PARIS AS CHIEF OF FIELD OPERATIONS. IN 1951 HE BECAME REGIONAL DIRECTOR FOR AFRICA, MIDDLE EAST AND EUROPE REGIONAL OFFICE. IN 1961 HE WAS TRANSFERRED TO NEW DELHI, INDIA, AS RESIDENT DIRECTOR FOR SOUTH CENTRAL ASIA. IN 1967 HE JOINED THE OFFICE OF THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR AT NY HEADQUARTERS AND BECAME DEPUTY EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR (PROGRAMMES) AND IN 1983 HE DIRECTED UNICEF'S REGIONAL OFFICE FOR THE MIDDLE EAST IN BEIRUT. DR. EGGER WAS A PIONEER AND A LEADING FORCE IN THE WORK OF UNICEF SINCE ITS INCEPTION. BECAUSE OF HIS EXTENSIVE KNOWLEDGE OF CHILDRENS PROBLEMS IN DEVELOPING COUNTRIES AND PROGRAMME POLICIES HE MOST RECENTLY FULFILLED SPECIAL ASSIGNMENTS IN RELATION TO CHILD SURVIVAL AND DEVELOPMENT ACTIONS AND IN PREPARATION OF UNICEF'S FORTIETH ANNIVERSARY TO BE COMMEMORATED IN 1986.
