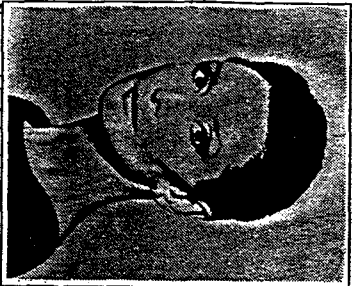

Audrey Hepburn 1929-1993

UNICEF's First Lady often stated that as a child, stranded in Holland during the Nazi invasion, she personally endured an existence fraught with fear and adversity. Experiencing firsthand the vital programs that saved so many young lives, and which marked the establishment of UNICEF, Audrey Hepburn dedicated herself to UNICEF's work.

She was born in Belgium, the daughter of a British father and a Dutch mother. Trained in ballet, at a young age she had a small part in a French film. This part led to an invitation from Colette to play the title role in her new play, "Gigi". She soon won major roles in a host of memorable films, starting with "Roman Holiday", for which she won an Academy Award.

Audrey Hepburn was the best representative UNICEF could have had. In her capacity as UNICEF Goodwill

Ambassador, she was a passionate advocate for children, traveling to virtually every area of the world where children are in need of assistance. She gave them hope with her presence; she spoke eloquently on their behalf

to world leaders, the media, volunteers and contributors, encouraging support for UNICEF programs. Her commitment to children and her tireless efforts for them defined the last years of her life. Surely this was Audrey Hepburn's greatest role.

To continue her work, the U.S. Committee for UNICEF has established an Audrey Hepburn Memorial Fund.
