RECOMMENDATION OF EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR FOR
AN ALLOCATION TO KOREA

1. This document embodies the Administration's recommendations for an allocation of \$1,000,000 for further UNICEF aid to Korea.
2. Members have been informed in separate documents of the effect of recent developments in Korea on the UNICEF programme there and of the consequent status of this programme (E/ICEF/R.77; E/ICEF/153, page 35; E/ICEF/153/Corr. 1; E/ICEF/155, paragraphs 38-41).
3. To recapitulate, it will be recalled that the Executive Board has heretofore allocated \$550,000 for programmes in South Korea. Prior to the outbreak of hostilities in June 1950, the following programmes had been approved for implementation:

Supplementary Child Feeding	\$95,000
Immunization against Common Childhood Diseases	47,000
Maternal and Child Health Training and Services	<u>73,000</u>
	\$215,000

Warfare in Korea made it impractical to proceed with the latter two programmes. At the same time it raised unforeseen emergency needs. Therefore, after consulting the Chairman of the Programme Committee, the Administration has devoted the entire allocation to supplies for relief purposes. These supplies include approximately \$50,000 worth of supplies procured prior to June 1950.
