Heads of state Oldest and youngest
 The oldest head of state in the world is Félix Houphouët-Boigny, president of Ivory Coast (b. 18 Oct 1905). The youngest is King Mswati III of Swaziland (b. 19 Apr 1968). (See Youngest King and Queen, above.)



First female presidents Isabel Perón (b. 1931) of Argentina became the world's first female president when she succeeded her husband on his death on 1 Jul 1974. She held office until she was deposed in a bloodless coup on 24 Mar 1976. President Vigdis Finnbogadóttir (b. 1930) of Iceland became the world's first democratically elected female head of state on 30 Jun 1980.

state and heads of government took place on the occasion of the World Summit for Children, held on 29-30 Sep 1990. The conference at the headquarters of the United Nations in New York

City was attended by 71 world leaders and dealt with the plight of children worldwide.

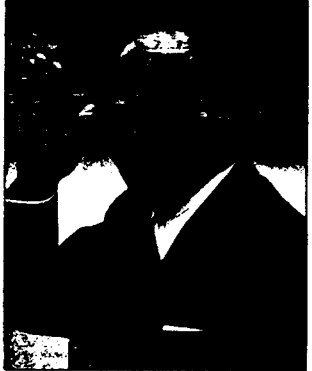
PRESIDENTS

Oldest The oldest president was Ronald Wilson Reagan, who was 69 years 349 days old when he took the oath of office. He was reelected at age 73.

Youngest The youngest president to assume office was Theodore Roosevelt. Vice-President Roosevelt became President at the age of 42 years, 10 months when President William McKinley was assassinated in 1901. The youngest president ever elected was John Fitzgerald Kennedy, who took the oath of office at age 43 years 236 days in 1961.

Term of office Franklin Delano Roosevelt served the longest term—12 years 39 days (1933-45) as President of the United States. The shortest term in office was 32 days (4 Mar-4 Apr 1841) by William Henry Harrison.

Most ex-presidents living Between 4 Mar 1861 (the inauguration of Abraham Lincoln) and the death of ex-president Tyler on 18 Jan 1862, there were five ex-presidents living: Martin

ing of Arakan (now part of Myanmar), is reputed to have reigned for 96 years between 1112 and 1113. The longest reign of a monarch was that of Afonso III of Portugal, who ascended the throne on 30 Apr 1112 and died on 6 Dec 1185, for a reign of 73 years 220 days, first as king and then as king.

Crown Prince Luis Filipe of Portugal was mortally wounded at the battle of Aljubarrota in 1580 that his father was killed and he severed his carotid artery. The two great arteries carry blood to the head, in the street on 1 Feb 1908. He was killed by a bullet from a crowd of about 20 minutes.

post-nominal number The highest post-nominal number is that of a member of a royal family, briefly enjoyed by Charles IX of France (LXXV Reuss zu Schleiz (1805-1880)). All male members of this family are called Heinrich, successively numbered from I to XXIV in three sequences—the first from 1696 (and ended with Heinrich VIII) and the second began in 1803 with Heinrich XLVII) and the third began in 1910. These are post-nominal numbers and should not be confused with regnal numbers (years of reign).

longest-lived royal The longest-lived royal on record was Zita, Empress of Austria and Queen of Hungary, who reigned as Emperor Charles I and King Charles IV of Hungary from 1916-18; she died on 14 Mar 1989, aged 96 years 309 days, after living in exile from 23 Mar 1919. (See Monarchs, above.)

youngest king and queen The youngest king is Mswati III of Swaziland, who was crowned on 25 Apr 1960 at the age of 15 days. He was born Makhotlong on the 10th of King Sobhuza II's country with the youngest queen, Queen Margrethe II of Denmark, with Queen Margrethe II (b. 1946).

shortest monarch The world's shortest monarch is the 6-ft-3-in-tall King Tāufa'āloa of Tonga, who in September 1953 weighed on the only adequate scale in the country at the airport weighing 462 lb. By 1985 he was reported to have slimmed down to 308 lb. His embassy car in London, Great Britain, has the license plate "1 TONGA".

prolific The most prolific monarchs are the "royals" were Prince Hartman of Saxe-Coburg and Gotha (1613-86), who has 17 children, of whom 21 were born alive. The Russian Empress Elisabeth zu Salm-Reuth-Rudowitz (1623-88). HRH Duke Robert II of Monaco (1848-1907) also had 24 children by two wives.

his daughters, Zita, Empress of Austria and Queen of Hungary (1892-1989).
